Description: The Den Chief works with the Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, and Den Leaders in the Cub Scout pack. The Den Chief provides knowledge of games and Scout skills that many Den Leaders lack. The Den Chief is also a recruiter for the Troop.

Type: Appointed by the Scoutmaster and approved by Packmaster and Den Leader

Term: Six months

Reports To: Scoutmaster and Den Leader

Mentor: Den Leader

Qualifications

Rank: Minimum First Class

Experience: None required

Attendance: 75% of Troop activities over the previous six months

Responsibilities

- Know the purposes of Cub Scouting
- Help Cub Scouts advance through Cub Scout ranks.
- Encourage Cub Scouts to join a Boy Scout Troop upon graduation.
- Assist with activities in the Den and Pack meetings.
- Be a friend and role model for the boys in the den.

Expectations

- Complete position-specific Junior Leader Training.
- Attend 90% of all Troop and Pack functions. Be on time.
- If unable to attend an activity, you must notify the Packmaster in advance.
- Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly with all insignia in the correct location and shirt tucked in.
- Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law and exhibiting Scout Spirit.

- Assist the Den leader with the planning for the Blue and Gold Banquet.
- Work with Den leader in preparing plans for weekly Den activities and carrying out your assignments resulting from the planning.
- Assist the Den leader with planning and carrying out one or more service projects during the Scout year.
- Work with Den leader to plan and teach Scouts outdoor skills (ex. camping, duty rosters, menu planning, cooking, equipment care/cleanup, knots, fire starting and safety, etc.).
