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## Troop 152 Junior Assistant Scoutmaster Position Description

### General Information

**Description:** The Junior Assistant Scoutmaster serves in the capacity of an Assistant Scoutmaster except where legal age and maturity are required. He must be at least 16 years old and not yet 18. He's appointed by the Scoutmaster because of his leadership ability. By accepting the position of Junior Assistant Scoutmaster, you agree to provide service and leadership to your Troop.

### Qualifications

**Rank:** Eagle

**Experience:** Previous Leadership Positions

**Attendance:** 75% of Troop activities over the previous six months

### Responsibilities

- Advise other junior leaders in their responsibilities.
- Attends Patrol Leaders' Council meetings.
- Carry out special assignments as directed by the Scoutmaster.
- Help SPL and ASPL as required to manage the Troop meeting.
- Provide help with maintaining discipline.
- Provide leadership in carrying out Troop activities.
- Provides hints and tips for the SPL and ASPL.
- Support the SPL and the ASPL in their assignments.

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## Troop 152 Junior Assistant Scoutmaster Position Description

### Expectations

- Complete position-specific Junior Leader Training.
- Attend all (or nearly all) Troop functions. Be on time. Notify the ASPL in advance and appoint a replacement if you cannot attend an event.
- Set a good example by wearing your uniform correctly (complete uniform, shirttail tucked in, all required badges in their correct locations).
- Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law and exhibiting Scout Spirit in your everyday life.
- Train and transition responsibilities to successor.

### Objectives

- You must attend the Troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.
- You are expected to attend 75% of all Troop Meetings, Patrol Leaders' Council meetings, Outings, and Service Projects. If your attendance is low, or if you have three (3) unexcused absences in a row, you can be removed from office.
- You are expected to give this job your best effort and use the adult leadership and advice when you feel they are needed
